Dear Mr. Rubinstein:

As we noted in our letter dated April 28, 2022, we are processing your request for material under the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. The Department of State has processed more than 300 pages of potentially responsive material since its last release and has identified an additional 8 responsive records subject to the FOIA. We have determined that all eight records may be released in part.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made redactions, the applicable FOIA exemptions are marked on each record. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released and is enclosed.

### The Freedom of Information Act (5 USC 552)

### **FOIA Exemptions**

Amb. Friedman,

This PLOCCA reporting requirement requires the President to report to Congress on compliance by the PLO or the Palestinian Authority with each of the following commitments found in <u>Sections 602, 603, and 604 of the Foreign Relations Authorization Act, FY 2003 ("the Act") (Public Law 107-228):</u>

- "(A) Recognition of the right of the State of Israel to exist in peace and security.
- (B) Acceptance of United Nations Security Council Resolutions 242 and 338.
- (C) Resolution of all outstanding issues in the conflict between the two sides through negotiations and exclusively peaceful means.
- (D) Renunciation of the use of terrorism and all other acts of violence and responsibility over all PLO elements and personnel in order to assure their compliance, prevent violations, and discipline violators." These commitments are also listed word for word in quotes under "II. Determinations as to Palestinian Compliance with their Commitments Required by Section 603 of the Act" on p. 2 and 3 the PLOCCA report that we sent to you. And right after each one is a sentence or two whether or not the PLO or PA has been in compliant with each of them.

Then in summary of **Section 604 of the Act**, if the President has determined the PLO or PA has not complied with each of the commitments above or if the President fails to make a determination with respect to such compliance, the President shall for certain period of time as described in statute impose one or more of the following sanctions:

- "(1) DENIAL OF VISAS TO PLO AND PALESTINIAN AUTHORITY OFFICIALS.—The Secretary shall direct consular officers not to issue a visa to any member of the PLO or any official of the Palestinian Authority.
- (2) DOWNGRADE IN STATUS OF PLO OFFICE IN THE UNITED STATES.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the President shall withdraw or terminate any waiver by the President of the requirements of section 1003 of the Foreign Relations Authorization Act of 1988 and 1989 (22 U.S.C. 5202) (prohib- iting the establishment or maintenance of a Palestinian information office in the United States), and such section shall apply so as to prohibit the operation of a PLO or Palestinian Authority office in the United States from carrying out any function other than those functions carried out by the Pales- tinian information office in existence prior to the Oslo Accords.
- (3) DESIGNATION AS A FOREIGN TERRORIST ORGANIZATION.— The Secretary shall designate the PLO, or one or more of its constituent groups (including Fatah and Tanzim) or groups operating as arms of the Palestinian Authority (including Force 17), as a foreign terrorist organization, in accordance with section 219(a) of the Immigration and Nationality Act.
- (4) PROHIBITION ON UNITED STATES ASSISTANCE TO THE WEST BANK AND GAZA.—United States assistance (except humanitarian assistance) may not be provided to programs or projects in the West Bank or Gaza."


