(U//FOUO) ADMINISTRATIVE REVISION: Probable Indicators of Violence in the Wake of the US Capitol Breach

(LI//FOUO) We assess that a range of possible targets, including government facilities and officials, law enforcement, and ideologically opposed individuals throughout the National Capital Region continue to be possible targets for domestic terrorists in the wake of the breach on the US Capitol. Domestic terrorists — motivated by grievances associated with the exercise of governmental authority, the presidential transition, or conspiracy theories — may particularly exploit First Amendment protected gatherings as a means of cover to commit violence. However, we lack specific, credible threats of violence at this time and assess that an attack could occur with little or no warning. The following chart highlights possible indicators of violence in the Washington, DC area. Some of the observed indicators listed may include constitutionally protected activity and should be evaluated in the totality of circumstances.

Definitions  (##FOWED) Domestic Terrorism: Any act of unlawful violence that is dangerous to human life or potentially destructive of critical infrastructure or key resources committed by a group or individual based and operating entirely within the United States or its herritories without direction or inspiration from a foreign terrorist group. This act is a violation of the criminal laws of the United States or of any state or other subdivision of the United States and appears to be intended to intimidate or correce a civilian population, to influence the policy of a government by intimidation or coercion, or to affect the conduct of a government by mass destruction, assessination, or kidnapping. A domestic terrorist differs from a homegrown violent extremist in that the former is not inspired by and does not take direction from a foreign terrorist group or other foreign power.
