

A popular fiction author criticized POTUS for being "mad at COVID" because it is harming "his election campaign" and not because of the American deaths the virus has caused. POTUS's election campaign account shared a video of POTUS claiming that his opponent will "delay the vaccine, delay the therapies, prolong the pandemic, close your schools, and shut down your country."

Twitter flagged this tweet for violating its Civic Integrity Policy. An online conservative pundit asserted that Twitter "falsely suggests that voting by mail is safer and more secure than voting in person." A musician and author claimed that a recent Supreme Court ruling invalidating mail-in ballots received after Election Day in Wisconsin makes voting dependent "upon the speed of the US Mail," which has been "sabotaged" by the POTUS appointed Postmaster General.


