Dear Mr. Block,

This is the twenty-fourth interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), received on April 4, 2022.

DHS reviewed 400 pages for this production. Of the 400 pages, 10 pages are being released in full and 46 pages are being released in part pursuant to FOIA Exemptions (b)(5) and (b)(6). I have considered the foreseeable harm standard when reviewing the record set and have applied the FOIA exemptions as required by the same statute and the Attorney General's Guidance. In addition, 322 pages were determined to be nonresponsive or duplicative. The 56 responsive pages are Bates Stamped DHS-1255-003956 through DHS-1255-004011.

In addition, DHS identified 22 pages that contain other office, component or agency equities that require additional review and are pending further consultation with other DHS offices, components, and/or other government agencies.
