Additional Information for Incident General Overview: On Wednesday 07/24/24 at approximately 1100 hours, ANSWER Coalition will be gathering on Pennsylvania Avenue, John Marshall Park, and the Meade Statue for a First Amendment Demonstration to "stop the genocide in Gaza". The group also intends to protest an address by the PM of Israel to a joint session of Congress. A march will occur after the rally and programming has concluded. USPP will provide site security of National Park Service properties, traffic control, crowd control, tactical response, plain clothes operations, and other law enforcement services as needed. All participants of the event will utilize available public access buildings for shelter

Evacuations/Safe Haven: For a weather related incident, USPP personnel working the event will be able to take shelter in government vehicles. All participants of the event will utilize available public access buildings for shelter as it is not provided by the organizer. For a critical incident, event participants will be directed away from the incident to safety. The direction of the evacuation will ultimately be determined by the Incident Commander based on the totality of the circumstances.

**Logistics**: Vehicles will be provided by USPP District 1 as needed for transportation of personnel to and from the site. No meals provided. Supervisors are encouraged to provide breaks for food and water as needed.

March Route: 3rd Street NW, East on Constitution Ave NW, North on Louisiana Ave, and terminate in Columbus Plaza.

Marshals / Security: The organizer will have 200 marshals that will be assigned to permitted areas to maintain order. They will be identified by arm bands and vests.

Media: The organizer will have a media staging area on Constitution Ave NW west of 3rd Street on city property.

**Medical**: The organizer will have a First Aid tent which will be staffed by a team of health care professionals. They will also have a Hydration tent for water distribution. These will be located in John Marshall Park.

DCFEMS will be staging additional assets in the area of the National Mall in anticipation of increased visitation. DCFEMS will provide 2 Command Supervisors, 4 medic units, and 2 UTV's for patient extraction.

Traffic / Road Closures: USPP will be closing Madison and Jefferson Drive from 3rd to 7th Street in anticipation of increased visitation and a march that will be conducted after the rally has ended. MPD will be enacting road closures on Pennsylvania Ave between 3rd and 6th Street NW. MPD will be providing intermittent road closures to facilitate a First Amendment march.

**Notes**: The organizer indicated an interest in deploying a banner (with breaks) on MPD roadways to conduct their 1st Amendment Demonstration. The march route may move in a direction which goes around the US Capitol. The organizer has indicated to NPS they are not going to be performing acts of civil disobedience. Organizer indicated 31 buses are transporting people to the rally and parking at Union Station.





# 8. Intelligence Report ((U//FOUO) On 24 July 2024, various groups will meet in the vicinity of the U.S. Capitol to demonstrate against Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu as he addresses a Joint Session of Congress. #### **Activity Overview:**

The ANSWER Coalition will conduct a demonstration to stop the genocide in Gaza. The demonstration will occur from 10:00 am – 1:00 pm feature speeches and conclude with a march to Columbus Plaza. The primary location for the demonstration is on the closed portion of Pennsylvania Avenue between 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Streets. There will be portable restrooms, hydration station, button sales area and a first aid stand setup in John Marshal Park. The Pennsylvania Avenue sidewalks between 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Street will be used as overflow area for participants. The maximum estimated number of participants is 5000.

# **General Conditions**

- A. This permit authorizes the use of the following park areas located within National Mall and Memorial Parks from 5:00 am on July 24 and concluding at 4:00 pm on July 24, 2024:
  - a. John Marshall Park
  - Pennsylvania Avenue NHS north and south sidewalks between 3<sup>rd</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> Streets
  - c. Columbia Plaza (2:00 pm -4:00 pm)
- B. All structures must adhere to attached site plan; no additional structure (s) may be erected except in accordance with the site plan, permit and in coordination with permits office. Permittee indicated they are no longer setting up symbolic tents as part of the demonstration. Structures not listed in the permit will be removed and all permitted structures must be erected by the start of the demonstration rally start time. See equipment list above. No site plan was provided by organizer as required by event guidelines.
- C. \*NOTE: Due to the possibility of security measures, Presidential movements, and Head of State visits, permitted activity locations may be, temporarily moved and/or suspended.
- D. The permittee is responsible for adhering to NCA Fire and Life Safety Temporary Event Policy and ensuring that all generators, tents, portable heaters and other applicable equipment adhere to requirements outlined with the document and this permit. The permittee assumes full responsibility for event elements safety and must ensure their contractors fully understand requirements outlined in the permit. In addition, the site must be ready for inspection by AHJ and/or designated representative prior to the event and upon request.
- E. The Permittee is responsible for obtaining the necessary permissions and/or additional permits from the Metropolitan Police Department (202) 671-6522, United States Capitol Police (202) 224-8891or from other federal, state or local agencies or departments for the use of public lands other than those under the jurisdiction of the National Park Service.
- F. Due to the exceptional time constraints associated with this permit and the complexity of multiple vendors bringing materials and equipment to park land, special attention is assigned to the requirement that the permittee must at all times provide an on-site coordinator at each permitted location to be accessible to National Park Service and United States Park Police personnel during the setup activities and during the load in/out of the event.

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SIDEWALKS, AND COLUMBUS PLAZA DATE: JULY 24, 2024 (5:00 AM -4:00 PM)

- G. If Permittee or its agents/representatives/contractors/subcontractors cause any injury or damage to park system resources, they may be liable for costs and damages in accordance with the System Unit Resource Protection Act, 54 USC §§ 100721-100725.
- H. Permittee will be responsible for any injury to, loss of, or damage to federally owned or controlled lands, waters, or resources (natural or cultural resources or facilities) resulting from Permittee's activities under this permit, 18 USC § 1361.
- I. All request, correspondence and meetings with the National Park Service pertaining to this permit shall be scheduled by the <u>permittee in writing only</u>. All contractors, subcontractors or consultants must channel their request through the recognized representatives of the permittee who in turn will contact the National Park Service representative.
- J. The Permittee is responsible for providing all necessary equipment/objects to conduct this activity. All equipment must be removed from the park immediately following the conclusion of the event. Items left in the park will be considered abandoned property and will be removed by the National Park Service.
- K. Throughout the course of the permit, the Permittee will require employees/volunteers, and contractors, to exercise special care and attention to protect the resources of the permitted area and its environs. In addition, the Permittee must supervise their contractors, volunteers, and employees during setup and teardown to assure that there is no damage to park resources. The contacts must be present physically present at each of the location for the entire duration demonstration permit times. (See above timelines)

- L. The permittee shall require all employees and/or contractors to exercise all normal and reasonable safety precautions and to protect park visitors and property. Suitable devices such as barricades, fences, lanterns, etc. necessary for employee and public safety, shall be provided and adequately maintained. Such devices require the concurrence of the NPS Coordinator or designated representative.
- M. Marshals: The ANSWER Coalition will provide at least 200 identifiable marshals to coordinate the various areas of the demonstration. All marshals involved with the organization will wear hi-res security vest and/or armbands. Pursuant to 36 CFR 7.96 (g)(5)(xii) organizers must undertake in good faith all reasonable action to provide sufficient marshals, to ensure good order and self-discipline in conducting such demonstration. Marshals should be aware of their responsibilities and location(s) where they will be stationed and have received from organizers adequate training and instructions. Marshals should be aware of the time and location of the assembly and any march routes, the location of any first aid stations, water, and toilets, be knowledgeable of the NPS permit conditions, be able to communicate with law enforcement. Marshals' area expected to report any problems they observe to Law Enforcement and/or National Park Service Permit Monitors. While marshals do not act as police, they do help maintain order among participants, explain to non-participants that a particular area may be under permit, and be able to alert their supervisor and the United States Park Police in the event they observe a problem on Federal parkland.

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- N. No interference with the pedestrian traffic and no blocking of entrances, sidewalks, or driveways is allowed. <u>No impediment to or disruption of vehicular traffic is permitted</u>. All areas are to remain open to the general public at all times.
- O. <u>Medical Aid:</u> Person in charge is responsible for providing first aid services onsite. Permittee is required to adhere to recommendations provided by DC Fire and EMS. Permittee can rely on 911 for transport of patience. At a minimum permittee must have one Basic Life Support Medical Aid station and mobile med teams in all permitted locations. Please see attached plan for permittee medical plan.

P. Commercial Advertising Signage: Consistent with long-standing NPS regulations and policy, and Public Law 108-108, Title I, §145, the erection, placement, or use of structures and signs bearing commercial advertising is prohibited for any special event. The recognition of special events sponsors, however, may be allowed if it has been specifically authorized by this permit.

A permit may be issued that authorizes the recognition of sponsors of special events, if the NPS determines that the size and form of the recognition is consistent with the special nature and sanctity of the National Mall or any other requested park area, and if the lettering or design identifying the sponsor is no larger than one- third the size of the lettering or design identifying the special event. Further, to the maximum extent practicable for such special events, public use of and, access to the National Mall and other parkland is not to be restricted.

The Permittee shall submit a sign plan for NPS review and approval. Any request seeking NPS approval for sponsor recognition must be submitted to the NPS at least 14 days prior to the proposed event, and if approved by the NPS, will be authorized within the terms of the special event permit. Authorized sponsor recognition must be in keeping with NPS policy, regulations, and laws and be appropriate to the scale and theme of the special event. Further, the overall size, number, and design of any signs or banners shall be appropriate to the park setting and lettering or design identifying the special event. Signs and banners may not be affixed to existing trees or other NPS facilities or structures.

Only signs and/or banners specifically identifying and/or announcing the event or portion of the event are permitted. Commercial sponsors may be recognized on these same banners by letters and/or logos not to exceed one-third the height and width of the primary lettering identifying the event.

Q. Special attention is drawn to item #4, on the last page of this document, concerning solicitation and sales. No fee may be collected, donation solicited, or commercial activity conducted. No items may be sold or offered for sale except for books, newspapers, leaflets, pamphlets, buttons and bumper stickers which contain a message related to your demonstration or special event. Permittee will have onsite sales at John Marshall Park, Pennsylvania Avenue Sidewalks north and south between 3<sup>rd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> Streets, the stand or structure may consist of one table per site, which may be no larger than 2 ½ ft by 8ft or 4ft by 4ft. The dimensions of the sales site may not exceed 6ft (w) by 15ft long by 6ft high. No other items maybe sold other than those listed.

Sales table is located in the John Marshall Park and Pennsylvania Avenue Sidewalks between  $3^{rd}-5^{th}$  Streets, permittee has not provided a detailed site plan. Permittee has indicated the sales of buttons.

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- R. All sound amplification equipment shall be limited so that it will not unreasonably disturb nonparticipating persons in, or in the vicinity of, the area. National Park Service has issued a Record of Determination in John Marshall Park during regular business hours, therefore no amplified sound is allowed in John Marshall Park as part of this activity.
- S. Balloons of any kind, glass containers and alcoholic beverages are not permitted.
- T. The collection of entry/registration fee is prohibited on parkland.
- U. Permittee's desiring the use of temporary structures, i.e. cable trusses, stages, audio and/or video towers and tents, whose dimensions are (500) square feet or more, shall provide Life Safety Code certification statements confirming the safety of all temporary structures. In the event that the manufacture's certifications are not available, permittee will submit to the NPS stamped engineered drawings for NPS review and approval. Smaller structures cannot be attached or within 5ft of another to create a larger structure.
- V. All activities pursuant to this permit shall be in compliance with the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252; 42 U.S.C. 200d ed seg.); Title V, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (87 Stat. 394; 29 U.S.C 794); the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (89 Stat. 728; 42 U.S.C. 6101 et seg.); and with all other Federal laws and regulations prohibiting discrimination of grounds of race, color, national origin, handicap, religion, or sex in employment and in providing facilities and services to the public. Nothing advertising for employees shall be done which will prevent those covered by these laws from qualifying for employment.
- W. <u>Portable Restrooms</u>: If attendance is expected to exceed the capacity of nearby NPS public comfort facilities, or if none exist in or near the requested park area, the Permittee must provide portable, temporary toilets with sufficient capacity to accommodate anticipated attendance. The general guideline is a minimum of (1) portable toilet per (300) people, of which at least twenty percent (%20) must be handicapped accessible. The restrooms should be grouped in banks of five with a six-foot clearance between each bank.

  - Portable restroom trucks may not drive on sidewalk and should furnish a hose long enough to clean portable restrooms
  - Portable restrooms must be delivered and removed the same day of the demonstration.
- X. <u>Tents:</u> Permittee's authorized use of temporary structures, i.e. cable trusses, stages, audio and/or video towers and tents, whose dimensions are (900) square feet or more, shall provide Life Safety Code certification statements confirming the safety of all temporary structures. In the event that the manufacture's certifications are not available, permittee will submit to the NPS stamped engineered drawings for NPS review and approval. Smaller structures cannot be attached or within 5ft of another to create a larger structure.
  - A minimum 10ft. clearance must be maintained from tents to any flammable or combustible materials or vegetation.

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b. Aisle Width: The width of aisles serving seating at tables shall be not less than 44 in. where serving occupant load exceeding 50 people, and 36 in. where serving an occupant load of 49 people or fewer. In addition all tent exits must have a minimum head clearance height of 7ft.

c. Exit and Occupant Loads for Enclosed Tents: Tents that have sides attached and those with rolled up sides which are capable of being enclosed shall meet the following occupancy load and exit requirements.

Tents must be supported by water barrels or cement blocks. <u>STAKING IS NOT PERMITTED.</u> In order to prevent damage to brick, stonework, or other surfaces, protective material such as plywood, carpet squares or rubber pads must be in place under all equipment, including speaker stands, lighting stands, generators, tables and tents.
- TT. <u>GENERATORS</u>: No generators have been requested at the permitted areas, therefore generators are prohibitied.

# General Resource Protection:

- YY. Pursuant to 36 CFR 7.96(g)(xii), the alteration, damage, or removal of park resources or facilities is prohibited. No holes may be dug and no item, including signs or banners, may be attached to park trees, plantings, benches, fences, light standards, or any other park landscape element.
- ZZ. It is prohibited to climb, remove, or in any way injure any statue seat, wall, fountain, light poles, elevator towers, or other erection or architectural feature, or any tree, shrub, or landscaping feature within the park. Permittee is responsible for informing event participants and providing marshals to ensure compliance with this permit condition.
- AAA. Public Access: Sidewalks and entrances seven feet wide or larger, a six foot minimum clearance must be maintained at all times to allow for two wheelchairs to pass each other. And for sidewalks and entrances of (5-6) feet wide, a four-foot minimum width must be maintained at all times for wheel chair accessibility.
- BBB. In order to prevent damage to brick, stonework, or other surfaces, protective material such as plywood or rubber pads must be in place under all equipment, including speaker stands, lighting stands, generators, tables and tents.
- CCC. Helium inflated items and drones are not permitted on Parkland.
- DDD. <u>Trash/debris pickup:</u> Permittee indicated to be responsible for all trash and debris from the permitted areas immediately after the conclusion of the demonstration. Trash receptacles for this effort shall be provided and removed from the site accordingly by the permit holder. Trash receptacles must not overflow with trash or debris. Use of clear trash bags is required for all trash receptacles used for the event.
- EEE. <u>Fire Hydrants:</u> A minimum 36 in. of clear space shall be maintained to permit access to and operation of fire protection equipment, fire department inlet connections, or fire protection system control valves. Vehicles must maintain a 15 ft. clearance of all fire hydrants.
- FFF. Outdoor Equipment. (A) Wet Locations. All switches, circuit breakers, receptacles, control equipment, and metering devices located in wet locations shall be weatherproof. (NFPA70:551.78 (2017)
- GGG.OPEN-FLAME DEVICES. Open-flame decorative devices, candles, oil lamps, decorative torches and gas lights are NOT authorized in any tent or temporary structures.
- HHH.COMBUSTIBLE OR FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS shall NOT be stored on NPS property. NCA-AHJ
- III. Weather (adverse) Policy during an Event Program: When there is a threat to public health or safety, the Superintendent and/or designee, may close the National Mall or an event being hold there for such duration as determined necessary to ensure the safety and well being of the public. Such situations have occasionally occurred in the past where park areas have been closed due to severe weather warning of heavy snow, thunderstorms with lighting, high winds, cold and intense heat. Where an area is ordered closed due to a weather-related public safety threat, pursuant to 36 CFR

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2.32 people must comply with official directions to leave the closed area and relocate to safer sheltered locations. Weather will be monitored throughout the duration of the event. Permittee is responsible for ensuring that adequate resources are available to deal with extreme weather conditions. For example extreme heat, cold, snow etc. Permittee is responsible for removing snow from flooring, however the Park Superintendent must approve type equipment used or any deicer.





A. This permit authorizes use of the Mall-Gravel Panel at 4<sup>th</sup> Street & Turf Panel #26, Between 4<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Streets, pursuant to the following permit conditions and may be amended by the National Park Service to reflect changing conditions.

B. Permittee is responsible for providing all necessary equipment/objects to conduct this activity. All equipment must be removed from park property immediately following the conclusion of the event. Items left on park property will be considered abandoned property and will not be the responsibility of the National Park Service.

# C. Structures:

The Permittee shall insure that all facilities and structures placed on park property adhere to all applicable codes, standards, and regulations including but not limited to BOCA, OSHA, USPHS, IBC 2006, IFC 2006 and ADA, covering requirements including but not limited to safe construction practices, grounding of generators and maintaining access to the Mall.

Additional Conditions Permit #24-1408

To protect the turf areas, it is strongly encouraged that structures be placed on hardscape areas where it would not impact the turf. The NPS may allow under permit the use of turf areas, however, if the structure and its equipment use the turf protection measures as detailed throughout this permit. All structures must minimize all points that come in contact with the turf.

All structures must be able to withstand a minimum wind gust of 30 mph.

All structures must follow the guidelines below and adhere to National Fire Protection Association codes.

Any temporary structure exceeding over 500 square feet require the submission of engineered drawings stamped by a structural engineer licensed in the United States. Drawings should include tent support lines identified by flagging.

All screws and fasteners used in the construction of structures should be policed during the build and retained during removal.

Screws and fasteners should be made of a non-aluminum metal, enabling a post-event magnet sweep to ensure all pieces are removed from the site.

<u>Tents:</u> To protect the turf, tents should be located on hardscape surfaces including gravel, asphalt, concrete, granite, wood, etc. tents and other similar structures must be secured using cement blocks and/or water-filled ballast tanks. No stakes are permitted on hardscape surfaces. Non-freezing, no-staining liquid approved by the NPS (water treated with bio-degradable antifreeze) in plastic containers shall be used as weighing elements. No sandbags are permitted for this purpose.

At takedown, all water filled ballast tanks must NOT be pumped to the nearest catch basin (located within the curbs) or to the area drains located throughout the hardscape. Tanks may not be drained into the turf or pumped in gravel areas. This prevents creation of muddy puddles and soft areas in the turf and also limits runoff of gravel into area drains.

If approval is granted by NPS, no tent stakes may penetrate the ground surface by more than 18 inches. Use of stakes longer than this requires coordination through the Turf Management Specialist, National Mall & Memorial Parks, at (202) 245-4685.

Tents must be constructed of fire-retardant material. A certificate of fire-retardant material must be provided as confirmation to the NPS

Tents should be placed at least 5 to 10 feet apart.

<u>Clearance</u>. A minimum 10ft.clearance must be maintained from tents to any flammable or combustible materials or vegetation.

# D. Resource Protection:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 7.96(g)(5)(C)(xii), the alteration, adaptation, damage, or injuring, and/or removal of park resources or facilities are prohibited. No holes may be dug and no item, including signs or banners, may be attached to park trees, plantings, benches, or other park property. The alteration, adaptation, damage or injuring, and/or removal of park resources or facilities are prohibited.

E. LOGISTIC VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED TO PULL ONTO THE GRAVEL WALKWAYS, TO UNLOAD AND LOAD HEAVY EQUIPMENT. <u>VEHICLES WILL</u>

NOT BE ALLOWED TO DRIVE AND/OR PARK ON THE GRASS. Logistical vehicle access onto the Mall gravel walkways must be coordinated with Sgt. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)

and/or Sgt. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), United States Park Police. Permittee must call (202) 610-7092 to acquire any/all vehicle access passes.

# F. Specific Conditions for Mall-Center Turf Panels-3rd to 14th Street:

To protect the turf areas, it is strongly encouraged that structures be placed on the Mall's hardscape areas where it would not impact the turf. The NPS may allow under permit the use of turf areas, however, if the structure and its equipment use the turf protection measures as detailed throughout this permit. All structures must minimize all points that come in contact with the turf.

Logistical vehicles accessing the Mall with appropriate Vehicle Access Passes must drive at least five feet (5') away from the Mall center panel's granite curbs.

Event vehicles of any kind (delivery, cranes, forklifts, golf carts, trailers, exhibit trailers, etc. are not allowed on the Mall turf of curbs.

Back of house, trailers, bone yards, generators portable toilets etc. are not permitted on the turf panels or curbs.

Vehicle mounted signs, LED screens, media towers and light towers are not permitted on the turf panels or curbs.

Equipment used for set up must be kept at least two.five feet (2.5') away from the granite curbs.

All temporary facilities approved for placement on the Mall center panels must be hand carried onto the panels from the gravel walkways.

Stakes required for anchoring tents, scaffolding and other structures approved for placement on the Mall center turf panels must be eighteen inches (18") or smaller.

Additional Conditions Permit #24-1408

No staking within the designated "No-staking Zone" to protect irrigation lines. The no staking zone is the area at least ten feet (10') away from the edge of the granite curds and at least ten feet (10') away from either side of the center line of the Mall turf panel. Specific areas must be designated on approved site plan prior to staking.

Planting strips, along the 3rd and 4th Street edges of the turf panel, are no staking zones

Water filled ballast tanks and/or cement blocks may not be used on the turf.

Appropriate turf cover/ground protection material approved by NPS, is required for the setup of chairs or other seating on the turf panels.

Permittee is encouraged to secure products such as Terraplas, Terratile and Matrax LD or equal that is ADA-compliant, interlocking mats that are translucent and allow UV light to pass through to the grass below. The products must either be perforated or ribbed, allowing for ventilation and some moisture access to the turf below. Material to be used must be approved in advance by NPS. Plywood cannot be used as turf cover/ground protection.

- G. <u>Gravel Walkways</u>: Stages, stands and other facilities approved for placement on gravel walkways between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Streets must be supported by 3/4-inch plywood or similar material. *Material to be used must be approved in advance by NPS*.
- H. Unloading and loading of all other equipment must take place from the street curb only. All vehicles must park in designated, available public spaces. NOTE: Madison and Jefferson Drives are metered parking areas. Permittee is responsible for paying \$2.30 per hour, during the hours of 7:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. each day.

# I. Generators/electricity:

No electricity is available on site. Permittee may provide own gasoline and/or solar powered generator. The fueling/refueling of gasoline powered generators on parkland is prohibited. The storage of additional fuel is prohibited. Generators must be placed on the gravel walkway and ¾" plywood or similar material must be placed underneath the generator to protect the gravel areas.

Generators must also be enclosed with a perimeter security fence/barricade at least three feet (3') in height. The cord must be in good condition, of sufficient gauge to accommodate the electrical load of equipment and must be properly grounded.

All wires must be covered by mats and/or yellow jackets to prevent tripping hazards. When used for crossing of roadways or pedestrian paths, these devices must meet applicable ADA Standards.

Additional Conditions Permit #24-1408

All cables, power lines, etc. shall be run in an orderly manner and contained in matted yellow jackets that provide for safety and accessibility. No power lines can be strung between trees.

# Electrical Work/Appliances.

OUTDOOR electrical cords, receptacles, connections and or appliances shall be Underwriters Laboratories (UL), Listed and Labeled and or Factory Mutual (FM) approved for wet locations or OUTDOOR use and meet NFPA 70 National Electrical Code NEC. All shall be arranged to minimize the tripping hazard and shall be permitted to be covered with non-conductive matting, provided that the matting does not constitute a greater tripping hazard than the uncovered cables. NFPA 70:525.20 (G).

- J. Special attention is drawn to the last sentence, item #7, last page of this permit, concerning sound amplification. All sound amplification equipment shall be limited such that it will not unreasonably disturb nonparticipating persons in, or in the vicinity of, the area.
- K. The Permittee will be responsible for any injuries and/or damage to government property occurring as a result of this permitted activity.
- L. Permittee does not have exclusive use of the area including sidewalks and roadways. No interference with the pedestrian traffic and no blocking entrances, sidewalks, nor driveways allowed. No impeding vehicular traffic permitted. All areas remain open to the general public at all times.
- M. <u>Sales:</u> Special attention is drawn to item #4, last page of this permit, concerning fees collected and donations solicited on parkland. No merchandise may be sold or offered for sale except for message bearing books, newspapers, leaflets, pamphlets, buttons, and bumper stickers. Sales areas can be no larger than 6' wide by 15' long by 6' high and can have only one table 2 ½ 'by 8', or 4' by 4'. There are no sales associated with this permitted activity.

# N. Trash/Debris Collection & Removal:

Permittee is encouraged to clear all trash and debris generated as part of the permitted activity from the permit site grounds immediately after the conclusion of the event. Open trash and recycling containers on the Mall, between 3<sup>rd and</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> Street should be used for this effort. Permittee may provide additional trash and recycling receptacles to prevent the overflow of Mall containers. Trash receptacles must be placed on hard, paved surfaces and must not overflow with trash or debris. Use of **clear trash bags** is required for all trash receptacles used for the event.

Drones, balloons, and glass beverage containers are prohibited on parkland.


P. All proposed amendments or additions to this permit and all proposed locations of vehicles, equipment, storage, installations of any kind, areas of activity, work and power plans shall be submitted to the National Park Service for prior written approval. These proposals shall be in map or diagram form suitable for on the ground inspection. Placement of tents, trailers, stages, sound towers and any other detailed and specific equipment shall be indicated on the site map and will be provided to the National Park Service prior to installation.


# Q. Adverse Weather Policy:

When there is a threat to public health or safety, the Superintendent and/or his/or her designee, may close the National Mall or an event being held there for such duration as determined necessary to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the public. Such situations have occasionally occurred in the past where park areas have been closed due to severe weather warning of heavy snow and thunderstorms with lighting and high winds. Where an area is ordered closed due to a weather-related public safety threat, pursuant to 36 CFR 2.32(2) people must comply with official directions to leave the closed area and relocate to safer sheltered locations.

- R. <u>Additional Permits</u>: Person in charge is responsible for contacting the Metropolitan Police Department, (202) 671-6522, to obtain the necessary paperwork and/or permission for the use of city streets.

conversations over a straight-forward assembly activity, including two meetings as recently as yesterday. We object to what appear to be last-minute polificized efforts to obstruct our activity. As you know, we have organized demonstrations on public write in response to your email to us that you sent at 10:30 p.m. last night regarding the planned First Amendment activity tomorrow, in that email you raised new issues and obstructions that have not been raised despite weeks of meetings and space under the jurisdiction of NPS for decades.

The ANSWER Coalition applied for a permit with the National Park Service on June 18, 2024, to hold a demonstration and rally at the Mall between 3rd and 4th St on Wednesday, July 24th at the time of the scheduled address to the US Congress by the Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu. The National Park Service only met with our coalition on July 10th, 22 days after we had filed our permit application. At that meeting we were informed for the first time that our planned activity at 3rd St in the Mall was denied. At that time, you offered to give us an alternative space between 6th and 7th St on the Mall, placing our activity almost a mile away from the US Capitol.

personnel from NPS and other government agencies attended. Those meetings took place on July 10, July 18, and yesterday July 22 at 9 AM and at 3 PM. We have also spoken with Capitol Police multiple times, the latest being on July Since that time, we have moved our activity to primarily take place on the jurisdiction of the District of Columbia with some additional NPS space involved and we have attended multiple meetings with the National Park Service which dozens of 18th and twice on July 22 regarding our march route on streets under their jurisdiction. Vesterday, on July 22, at 10:30 PM I received a surprising letter from you notifying us that our permit application that we filed for the sidewalks on Pennsylvania Avenue and John Marshall Park, adjacent to our primary gathering on District of Columbia jurisdiction of Pennsylvania Ave, was still not approved. Your letter suddenly sought to add additional and new conditions before a permit could be approved. We are less than 24 hours away from our planned activity on July 24th One of the new demands was for the phone number and contact information of our volunteer security personnel who would be located at the Meade Statue Area. As you know, we had not originally requested a permit for the Meade Statue area, and after you had suggested that it was available and that we should request it, we considered using the space to set up chairs for people who would prefer to sit rather than stand during the rally, however, we subsequently decided not to use the Meade Statue area, which we informed you of in a prior meeting. We reiterate, that we are not using that location.

As you know, we filled out the permit application conforming to the requested information which included a contact phone number for myself, individuals "in charge" of the demonstration, and the contact information for the permit applicant.

We consider these new conditions to be highly irregular, and intrusive by the government into the organization of a First Amendment protected activity, and as such, not 'reasonable. The RPS appears to be making an unprecedented demand that we provide and identify personnel to you who would be responsible to exercise general law enforcement authority or to act at the direction of NPS in order to undertake general policing. This is highly inappropriate and we will not carrying out policing or law enforcement activities, including your request that we provide security around an NPS statue in a location which we are not even using.

in this letter, we are confirming ANSWER Coalition's plan to use Columbus Plaza on July 24 from 2-4 PM. As stated yesterday, we will not have an equipment set-up on the Plaza and will be using handheld portable sound.

Regarding your request that we specifically state we will not march towards Lafayette Park, we have previously provided you with our planned march route towards Columbus Plaza. Should we find that we are obstructed from marching on our planned route, it is always possible that we may march on the streets of the District of Columbia and would never waive our right to do so.

Record of Determination for a temporary restriction of access and closures to certain parklands in Rock Creek Park and National Mall and Memorial Parks associated with the Official visit of the United States Secret Service Protectee.

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 1.5, beginning the night of Sunday, July 21, 2024, the National Park Service is imposing a temporary closure of certain designated parklands for events associated with a Secret Service Protectee. This closure will be in effect from Sunday, July 21 through Friday, July 26, 2024, as delineated in the attached map and as further delineated by fencing.

Specifically, there will be a temporary restriction of vehicular access of the following locations from Sunday, July 21 at approximately 11:30 pm to approximately 12:30 am on Friday, July 26, 2024:

# National Mall and Memorial Parks

- Parkway Drive NW, between Rock Creek and Potomac Parkway NW and Lincoln Memorial Circle, NW. (the adjacent sidewalks and trails will remain open to pedestrian traffic)
- Rock Creek Parkway NW, between Virginia Avenue NW and the Potomac River Freeway NW.

# Rock Creek Parkway

Thompson Boat Center Parking Lot, 2900 Virginia Avenue, NW.

The following parklands will temporarily be closed to pedestrian access:

- The Washington City Canal Outfall section of the Rock Creek Trail.
- Thompson Boat Center Parking Lot, 2900 Virginia Avenue, NW.

In addition, at approximately 4:30 am on July 24 until approximately 1:00 pm on July 24, 2024, the following areas of Rock Creek Park will be temporarily closed to pedestrian access:


 Portions of Glover Archbold Park Trails, adjacent to the Washington Hebrew Congregation, specifically the Glover Archbold Park Trail and the Massachusetts 39<sup>th</sup> Trail, adjacent on the west to Massachusetts Avenue NW and on the east to 39<sup>th</sup> Street NW. These closures come at the request of the United States Secret Service and are necessary to provide a secure staging area as well as a secure perimeter with sufficient stand-off distance to protect the Secret Service Protectee during activities in the District of Columbia. The temporary restrictions are also necessary to permit the Secret Service to perform security sweeps of the area, facilitate arrivals and departures, allow for security screening, and restrict access to the areas and buildings surrounding the protectee's activities.

Less restrictive measures will not suffice due to the Secret Service's security-based assessment that these park areas need to be kept clear. It is further anticipated that Secret Service personnel will temporarily restrict public access in these areas during the installation and removal of antiscale fencing. These restrictions are expected to begin on Sunday, July 21, 2024, from approximately 11:30 p.m. until the removal of fencing by approximately 12:30 am on Friday, July 26, 2024. These public access restrictions are necessary during fence installation to ensure the safety of the public as well as the personnel engaged in installation. A copy of the Secret Service's map dated July 20, 2024, is attached and incorporated by reference.

This temporary and partial closure is not of a nature, magnitude and duration that will result in a "significant alteration in the public use pattern". Further, the closure will not adversely affect the park's natural, aesthetic or cultural values and is not of a highly controversial nature.

Rather, closures such as these are commonplace for summits and other occasions at which heads of state meet with government officials and are necessary to provide the public with as much access as possible to park land while also providing for the security the Secret Service has deemed necessary for this event.

Accordingly, the National Park Service determines publication as rulemaking in the Federal Register is unwarranted under 36 C.F.R. § 1.5(b). This is consistent with hundreds of earlier partial and temporary park closures or public use limitations, the legal opinion of the Office of the Solicitor, and judicial adjudications. Mahoney v. Norton, No. 02-1715 (D.D.C. August 29, 2002), plaintiff's emergency motion for injunction pending appeal denied Mahoney v. Norton, No. 02-5275 (D.C. Cir. September 9, 2002) (per curiam); Picciotto v. United States, No. 99-2113 (D.D.C. August 6, 1999); Picciotto v. United States, No. 94-1935 (D.D.C. September 9, 1994); Picciotto v. Lujan, No. 90-1261 (D.D.C. May 30, 1990); Picciotto v. Hodel, No. 87-3290 (D.D.C. January 26, 1988); Spiegel v. Babbitt, 855 F.Supp. 402 (D.D.C. 1994), aff'd in part w/o op. 56 F.3d 1531 (D.C. Cir. 1995), reported in full, 1995 US App. Lexis 15200 (D.C. Cir. May 31, 1995). Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 1.7, notice of this temporary and partial closure will be made though media advisories, maps, and by posting at conspicuous locations in the affected park areas. Finally, pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 1.5(c), this determination is available to the public upon request.

**Medical**: The organizer will have a First Aid tent which will be staffed by a team of health care professionals. They will also have a Hydration tent for water distribution. These will be located in John Marshall Park.

DCFEMS will be staging additional assets in the area of the National Mall in anticipation of increased visitation. DCFEMS will provide 2 Command Supervisors, 4 medic units, and 2 UTV's for patient extraction.







The permittee is responsible for adhering to NCA Fire and Life Safety Temporary Event Policy and ensuring that all generators, tents, portable heaters and other applicable equipment adhere to requirements outlined with the document and this permit. The permittee assumes full responsibility for event elements safety and must ensure their contractors fully understand requirements outlined in the permit. In addition, the site must be ready for inspection by AHJ and/or designated representative prior to the event and upon request.
- E. Suitable devices such as barricades, fences, lanterns, etc. necessary for employee and public safety, shall be provided and adequately maintained. Such devices require the concurrence of the NPS Coordinator or designated representative.
- M. Marshals: The ANSWER Coalition will provide at least 200 identifiable marshals to coordinate the various areas of the demonstration. All marshals involved with the organization will wear hi-res security vest and/or armbands. Pursuant to 36 CFR 7.96 (g)(5)(xii) organizers must undertake in good faith all reasonable action to provide sufficient marshals, to ensure good order and self-discipline in conducting such demonstration. Marshals should be aware of their responsibilities and location(s) where they will be stationed and have received from organizers adequate training and instructions. Commercial Advertising Signage: Consistent with long-standing NPS regulations and policy, and Public Law 108-108, Title I, §145, the erection, placement, or use of structures and signs bearing commercial advertising is prohibited for any special event. The recognition of special events sponsors, however, may be allowed if it has been specifically authorized by this permit.

A permit may be issued that authorizes the recognition of sponsors of special events, if the NPS determines that the size and form of the recognition is consistent with the special nature and sanctity of the National Mall or any other requested park area, and if the lettering or design identifying the sponsor is no larger than one- third the size of the lettering or design identifying the special event. Further, to the maximum extent practicable for such special events, public use of and, access to the National Mall and other parkland is not to be restricted.

The Permittee shall submit a sign plan for NPS review and approval. Any request seeking NPS approval for sponsor recognition must be submitted to the NPS at least 14 days prior to the proposed event, and if approved by the NPS, will be authorized within the terms of the special event permit. Authorized sponsor recognition must be in keeping with NPS policy, regulations, and laws and be appropriate to the scale and theme of the special event. Further, the overall size, number, and design of any signs or banners shall be appropriate to the park setting and lettering or design identifying the special event. Signs and banners may not be affixed to existing trees or other NPS facilities or structures.

Only signs and/or banners specifically identifying and/or announcing the event or portion of the event are permitted. Commercial sponsors may be recognized on these same banners by letters and/or logos not to exceed one-third the height and width of the primary lettering identifying the event.

Q. Special attention is drawn to item #4, on the last page of this document, concerning solicitation and sales. No fee may be collected, donation solicited, or commercial activity conducted. No items may be sold or offered for sale except for books, newspapers, leaflets, pamphlets, buttons and bumper stickers which contain a message related to your demonstration or special event. Permittee will have onsite sales at John Marshall Park, Pennsylvania Avenue Sidewalks north and south between 3<sup>rd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> Streets, the stand or structure may consist of one table per site, which may be no larger than 2 ½ ft by 8ft or 4ft by 4ft. The dimensions of the sales site may not exceed 6ft (w) by 15ft long by 6ft high. No other items maybe sold other than those listed.

Sales table is located in the John Marshall Park and Pennsylvania Avenue Sidewalks between  $3^{rd}-5^{th}$  Streets, permittee has not provided a detailed site plan. Permittee has indicated the sales of buttons.

- R. All sound amplification equipment shall be limited so that it will not unreasonably disturb nonparticipating persons in, or in the vicinity of, the area. National Park Service has issued a Record of Determination in John Marshall Park during regular business hours, therefore no amplified sound is allowed in John Marshall Park as part of this activity.
- S. Balloons of any kind, glass containers and alcoholic beverages are not permitted.
- T. The collection of entry/registration fee is prohibited on parkland.
- U. Permittee's desiring the use of temporary structures, i.e. cable trusses, stages, audio and/or video towers and tents, whose dimensions are (500) square feet or more, shall provide Life Safety Code certification statements confirming the safety of all temporary structures. In the event that the manufacture's certifications are not available, permittee will submit to the NPS stamped engineered drawings for NPS review and approval. Smaller structures cannot be attached or within 5ft of another to create a larger structure.
- V. All activities pursuant to this permit shall be in compliance with the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252; 42 U.S.C. 200d ed seg.); Title V, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (87 Stat. 394; 29 U.S.C 794); the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (89 Stat. 728; 42 U.S.C. 6101 et seg.); and with all other Federal laws and regulations prohibiting discrimination of grounds of race, color, national origin, handicap, religion, or sex in employment and in providing facilities and services to the public. Nothing advertising for employees shall be done which will prevent those covered by these laws from qualifying for employment.
- W. <u>Portable Restrooms</u>: If attendance is expected to exceed the capacity of nearby NPS public comfort facilities, or if none exist in or near the requested park area, the Permittee must provide portable, temporary toilets with sufficient capacity to accommodate anticipated attendance. The general guideline is a minimum of (1) portable toilet per (300) people, of which at least twenty percent (%20) must be handicapped accessible. The restrooms should be grouped in banks of five with a six-foot clearance between each bank.

In the event that the manufacture's certifications are not available, permittee will submit to the NPS stamped engineered drawings for NPS review and approval. Smaller structures cannot be attached or within 5ft of another to create a larger structure.
  - A minimum 10ft. clearance must be maintained from tents to any flammable or combustible materials or vegetation.

### General Resource Protection:

- YY. Pursuant to 36 CFR 7.96(g)(xii), the alteration, damage, or removal of park resources or facilities is prohibited. No holes may be dug and no item, including signs or banners, may be attached to park trees, plantings, benches, fences, light standards, or any other park landscape element.
- ZZ. It is prohibited to climb, remove, or in any way injure any statue seat, wall, fountain, light poles, elevator towers, or other erection or architectural feature, or any tree, shrub, or landscaping feature within the park. Permittee is responsible for informing event participants and providing marshals to ensure compliance with this permit condition.
- AAA. Public Access: Sidewalks and entrances seven feet wide or larger, a six foot minimum clearance must be maintained at all times to allow for two wheelchairs to pass each other. And for sidewalks and entrances of (5-6) feet wide, a four-foot minimum width must be maintained at all times for wheel chair accessibility.
- BBB. In order to prevent damage to brick, stonework, or other surfaces, protective material such as plywood or rubber pads must be in place under all equipment, including speaker stands, lighting stands, generators, tables and tents.
- CCC. Helium inflated items and drones are not permitted on Parkland.
- DDD. <u>Trash/debris pickup:</u> Permittee indicated to be responsible for all trash and debris from the permitted areas immediately after the conclusion of the demonstration. Trash receptacles for this effort shall be provided and removed from the site accordingly by the permit holder. Trash receptacles must not overflow with trash or debris. Use of clear trash bags is required for all trash receptacles used for the event.
- EEE. <u>Fire Hydrants:</u> A minimum 36 in. of clear space shall be maintained to permit access to and operation of fire protection equipment, fire department inlet connections, or fire protection system control valves. Vehicles must maintain a 15 ft. clearance of all fire hydrants.
- FFF. Outdoor Equipment. (A) Wet Locations. All switches, circuit breakers, receptacles, control equipment, and metering devices located in wet locations shall be weatherproof. (NFPA70:551.78 (2017)
- GGG.OPEN-FLAME DEVICES. Open-flame decorative devices, candles, oil lamps, decorative torches and gas lights are NOT authorized in any tent or temporary structures.
- HHH.COMBUSTIBLE OR FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS shall NOT be stored on NPS property. NCA-AHJ
- III. Weather (adverse) Policy during an Event Program: When there is a threat to public health or safety, the Superintendent and/or designee, may close the National Mall or an event being hold there for such duration as determined necessary to ensure the safety and well being of the public. Such situations have occasionally occurred in the past where park areas have been closed due to severe weather warning of heavy snow, thunderstorms with lighting, high winds, cold and intense heat. Where an area is ordered closed due to a weather-related public safety threat, pursuant to 36 CFR
