Dear Mr. Rubinstein:

As we noted in our letter dated December 29, 2023, we are processing your request for material under the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. Thus far, the Department of State ("the Department") has located two additional responsive records subject to the FOIA. Upon review, we have determined both records may be released in part.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made redactions, the applicable FOIA exemptions are marked on each record. Where applicable, the Department has considered the foreseeable harm standard when reviewing these records and applying FOIA exemptions. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released and is enclosed.

FOIA Exemptions



I know you don't need this extra intel from me since we have an entire team on the ground, but - as with a month ago - I am deeply concerned about what could develop out of this and feel I'd be negligent in not raising.

Thanks for the open door to provide this input. Best, Jeremy





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

Measures to ensure calm and avoid confrontation at Al Aqsa Mosque / Al Haram Al Sharif during Ramadan and beyond

Israel

- 1. Cease all actions and policies that undermines the Status Quo.
- 2. Closing Al Mughrabi gate during the month of Ramadan (coinciding dates start on 15 April). Closing it from that date onwards until the end of the Month.
- 3. Unhindered access of Muslim worshipers to Al Aqsa Mosque / Al Haram Al Sharif.
- 4. Imposing restrain orders on extreme Jews who are also actively involved in incitement activities and calls to storm Al Aqsa mosque / Al Haram Al Sharif..
- 5. Restricting lawmakers access and intrusions to Al Aqsa Mosque/ Al Haram Al Sharif
- 6. Easing security restriction in and around the Old City of Jerusalem.
- 7. Reduce police presence at Damascus Gate (One of the main entry points for the Old City of Jerusalem)
- 8. Stop restricting Waqf projects. The consolidation of Waqf authority and image will enable help maintaining calm.

List of Waqf Obstructed Projects and outstanding issues

- 1- Banning the Jordanian employment of 73 of al-Aqsa guards since 2017. (only 15 commenced work on Monday 14 February 2022)
- 2- Finishing the fire fight system and enable it to reach the roofed mosques.
- 3- Executing the inner and outer lighting of the Dome of the Rock.
- 4- Removing the Israeli police's loudspeakers installed on al-Aqsa walls.
- 5- Installing lightning rod on top of the Dome of the Rock.
- 6- Renovating Bab al-Rahmah, enabling the Ghazali Chair to use Bab al-Rhmah for teaching / learning and keep the site open for Muslim worshhppers.
- 8- Necessary tiling in many places in Al-aqsa.
- 9- Essential renovations at the Eastern Wall of al-Aqsa.
- 10- Allowing the entry of King Hussein Copy of Quraan into the museum of al-Aqsa.
- 11- Stop attempts of confiscating Waqf lands in Eastern Jerusalem, especially, in the surroundings of the Old City of Jerusalem, e.g. in al-Suwaneh and Silwan.
- 12- The municipality should return back the confiscated keys of the Waqf property at Al-Ghawanmeh Gate to the Jerusalem Awqaf.
