Dear Mr. Rubinstein:

As we noted in our letter dated July 31, 2024, we are processing your request for material under the Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”), 5 U.S.C. § 552. The Department of State (“Department”) has identified an additional 10 responsive records subject to the FOIA. We have determined all 10 records may be released in part.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made redactions, the applicable FOIA exemptions are marked on each record. Where applicable, the Department has considered the foreseeable harm standard when reviewing these records and applying FOIA exemptions. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released and is enclosed.


We are writing to request a briefing from the State Department to learn, in detail, the facts behind the recent decision by the Israeli Defense Ministry to designate six Palestinian nongovernmental organizations engaged in human rights and civil society work as "terrorist organizations." As you know, the designation of any civil society organization as a terrorist group is a matter of the utmost gravity, which is why Israel, like any other democracy in the world, should use the label of "terrorist" only when there is clear and unambiguous evidence that a group is engaged in terrorism. At the same time, the work of credible Palestinian NGOs involved in efforts to protect human rights and support vulnerable children should continue.

We therefore find it concerning that some Israeli human rights leaders, and foreign diplomats and journalists have argued the view that this recent designation is, at least in part, politically motivated to delegitimize and suppress certain NGOs. We welcomed the State Department's pledge to seek clarification from the Israeli government on this matter and appreciate the Israeli government's willingness to provide classified material as to why and how this determination was made. As Members of Congress committed to Israeli security, regional peace and transparency and dialogue with our foreign partners, we request the opportunity to review such material as well.


It is in the ultimate interest of the State of Israel, the Palestinian people, and the United States that a strong civil society exists throughout both Israel and Palestine, and it is essential that civil society and human rights organizations have the freedom to undertake their important work without fear of intimidation or suppression. With this in mind, we urge you to assess whether alternative and possibly more measured steps could have been taken to address concerns about these groups' activities and to work with your Israeli counterparts to ensure that any of the important projects the organizations were working on can continue in the service of the Palestinian people.

Thank you for your prompt attention to this request, and we look forward to working with you on this pressing and difficult problem.

Family of elderly Palestinian American who died after Israeli detention demands international inquiry
 New details emerge suggesting Omar Assad lost consciousness while still being held by Israeli soldiers

MILWAUKEE — The American family of a Palestinian American man who died last week after being detained by Israeli soldiers in the occupied West Bank called for an international investigation Sunday, saying Israel could not be trusted to hold accountable troops who allegedly pulled the 78-year-old from his car and left him lying unresponsive on the ground.

"We want justice," said Hala Hamad, 48, one of the daughters of the man who died, Omar Assad. "We want a thorough investigation from the U.S. government and the U.N. because [Israel] can't investigate their own crimes."

The Israeli military has said it is conducting its own investigation of the death of the former Milwaukee grocery store owner, who died early Wednesday after being stopped by Israeli soldiers in the Palestinian village of Jiljilya. A military official has said that Assad was detained after he resisted a roadside identification check and that he was alive when he was released soon after.

According to three Palestinian villagers who said they were on the scene, Assad was unresponsive when soldiers left him blindfolded and lying on his stomach on the ground. On Sunday, a Palestinian man who had been detained at the same time said Assad was not breathing when the soldiers departed, and a neighborhood doctor who reached Assad within minutes of being called to scene said his face was blue and he had apparently already been without oxygen for 15 to 20 minutes.

The Israeli military did not immediately respond to a request for comment on these latest accounts.

The U.S. State Department has asked Israel for "clarification" of the events surrounding Assad's death. Palestinian officials said Monday the results of an autopsy would not be released for several days.

In a year of conflict and covid, Gaza life continues amid the rubble

Assad died in his childhood village in the central West Bank, where he and his wife of five decades, Nazima Abdullah, returned in 2010 after spending most of their lives in the American Midwest. After immigrating as newlyweds in 1967, Assad started and ran businesses in Wisconsin and Illinois, his family said. The couple raised seven children in the United States, five of whom gathered Sunday in Milwaukee at the house of daughter Noha Saleh, 36, to remember their father as devoted, sociable and a proud believer in the American Dream.

"The community and our family, everyone lost a generous, loving family man," Hamad said in an interview.

(American family members put his age at 78, two years younger than relatives in the West Bank initially said last week, and spelled his last name Assad, rather than As'ad as initially transliterated from Arabic by journalists.)

Assad had owned neighborhood grocery stores on Milwaukee's South Side and around Chicago. He had an entrepreneurial mind-set, buying and selling stores at a rapid clip — he kept two main stores in Milwaukee for decades while flipping dozens of others through the years — even if his business instincts were not always great, his children said. They joked that his stores often prospered soon after he sold them.

But he was an unfailingly generous owner, they said, known for extending credit to customers who did not seem likely to pay up. "He never bothered to chase them down or anything like that, because he figured they needed it," said daughter Haya Assad, 45.

Omar Assad had been unable to visit the United States in recent years because of the coronavirus pandemic, but he remained in almost daily contact with one or another of his children or 17 grandchildren, Hamad said. The calls sometimes stretched to two or three hours and usually included talk of food and love of family, relatives said.

His last call came the day before he died, when he asked his youngest daughter, Saleh, whether she approved of the batch of West Bank olives and olive oil he had shipped her. "I picked the best, the best kind of olives for you guys," Assad said, his daughter recalled. "Do you want more? I will send you guys more. I will send you anything you need. Anything you need at all."

One night later, Saleh's sister in Arkansas called to say their father was dead.

"We were just shocked," Saleh said quietly, tears forming in her eyes. She was joined by the five siblings who live in Milwaukee. As they spoke, some of Assad's 17 grandchildren could be heard roughhousing in the upstairs bedrooms. He also leaves behind three great-grandchildren.

While aware of the tensions between Palestinians and Israeli soldiers and settlers in the West Bank, family members were surprised that the deadly encounter had occurred in the parents' quiet village. The hillside community is home to many Palestinians who have returned from the United States and Brazil and retired, like Assad, to large houses built with their overseas earnings.

"You've got a better chance of winning the lottery, honestly, than in getting stopped in our village," said son Hadi Assad, 41. "We never thought in a million years that something like this could happen there."

Omar Assad had suffered from heart problems that necessitated quadruple bypass heart surgery in 2014, his family said. But he emerged spry and active, returning to a vibrant social life, often playing cards with relatives well into the early morning hours.

On the night he died, he had dropped his wife off at home and returned to socialize at a cousin's house, his family said. He was driving home from another late night when stopped about 3 a.m., they said.

A villager watching from a neighboring house described seeing soldiers pull Assad from his car by his coat and march him forcibly toward a nearby under-construction house.

Another villager, Abdulaziz Hamouda, 56, said he was stopped at the same spot by Israeli soldiers about a half-hour later and taken to the same construction site. Hamouda and his passenger, Mraweh Abdulrahman, said they were held in a courtyard with at least two others they could see in the darkness.

The men were all ordered to sit or kneel on the ground. After his eyes adjusted, Abdulrahman has said, he noticed Assad lying motionless about 10 feet away. The soldiers left the scene shortly after one of them seemed to squat and check on the moving body, Abdulrahman has said.

Contacted Sunday, Hamouda confirmed Abdulrahman's account. When the soldiers left, Hamouda said, he joined his friend at Assad's side. "The man was dead," Hamouda said.

Islam Abu Zaher is a physician who was working the overnight shift at the Arab Medical Center just yards from the construction site. He responded to a call from the site shortly after 4 a.m.

"I was there within two minutes," he said. "He had no pulse, no breathing. His face was blue. In my medical experience, he had been without oxygen for 15 to 20 minutes."

The U.S. Embassy in Israel repeated Monday that it expects Israel to carry out a "thorough investigation" of the death. "We are deeply concerned by media reports of the circumstances surrounding Mr. As'ad's death and are gathering additional information about the incident," the embassy said in an emailed statement sent by a spokesperson.

Israel/West Bank: Israeli Government Advances Construction Tenders, Planning in East Jerusalem and the West Bank

1. ~~(SBU)~~ **Summary:** The Government of Israel advanced multiple plans and tenders for thousands of housing units in Jerusalem and the West Bank in the first part of January, with the most controversial of these being the completion and awarding of tenders for 1,257 units in Givat Hamatos, an area of southern Jerusalem under close watch by several western European states and some Israeli NGOs that claim it threatens the contiguity of a potential future Palestinian state by further surrounding the Palestinian neighborhood of Beit Safafa. Construction tenders were also announced for an additional 2,572 housing units in the West Bank and East Jerusalem and the promotion of plans for 780 settlement housing units. Several western European diplomats and some Israeli NGOs condemned the developments, while pro-settlement organizations highlighted the continued need for housing and infrastructure. Contacts assess that settlements are not expected to be a significant issue in the upcoming March 23 elections, despite media rumors alleging Prime Minister Netanyahu offered increased construction in northeastern Jerusalem as part of an early February political deal. Media reactions focused on the timing of the announcements immediately prior to the U.S. presidential inauguration. Palestinian Authority Prime Minister Shtayyeh on January 18 expressed hope that the Biden Administration would be able to stop the settlement expansion in the West Bank and East Jerusalem. **End summary.**

Givat Hamatos Tenders Quickly Awarded after Injunction Lifted

2. ~~(SBU)~~ On January 20, the Israel Land Authority awarded construction tenders for 1,257 units in Givat Hamatos, three days after bidding closed. Givat Hamatos is an area within the southern limits of the Jerusalem municipal boundary that is contentious because of concerns Israeli construction there would further surround the Palestinian neighborhood of Beit Safafa with predominantly Jewish communities. Western European diplomats and several Israeli NGOs argue that Israeli construction there could block contiguity of a potential future Palestinian state by dividing the Jerusalem and Bethlehem Palestinian communities and have denounced the construction tender process since it was announced in February 2020. The master plan for Givat Hamatos was approved in 2014, at which time the United States said construction in Givat Hamatos would “poison the atmosphere” with the Palestinians and “call into question Israel’s commitment” to peace. NGO contacts believe the government refrained from issuing the tender until 2020 for political reasons. The Israel Land Authority now has 90 days to finalize and sign contracts with the winning bidders, although NGO contacts expect contracts will be finalized before the 90-day deadline, given the unusually rapid awarding of the tenders. Contacts from the Israeli NGO Ir Amim also noted that while the bureaucratic process normally could take a year after signing contracts before builders broke ground, they expect these processes to be expedited for this project.

3. ~~(SBU)~~ Ir Amim and Palestinian residents of East Jerusalem are challenging the construction tender, with a court hearing scheduled for May 27, although Ir Amim contacts believe that the challenge is more likely to result in changes to the tender than in stopping construction. The legal challenge led to a January 15 injunction on the tender process, although the presiding

judge reversed the injunction two days later after further review of the case. The legal challenge by Ir Amim cites housing discrimination against East Jerusalem Palestinians because the tender includes subsidized housing for Israeli citizens, for which most legal residents of East Jerusalem are ineligible. Ir Amim contacts were not hopeful that the legal process could stop construction once contracts are signed and believed that the government would probably prefer to amend the tender if possible and move forward with construction rather than re-issue it and start the process over. However, contacts also noted that there was precedent for reversing the tender process prior to construction and that the government can do so legally.

Additional Construction Tenders Announced in West Bank, East Jerusalem

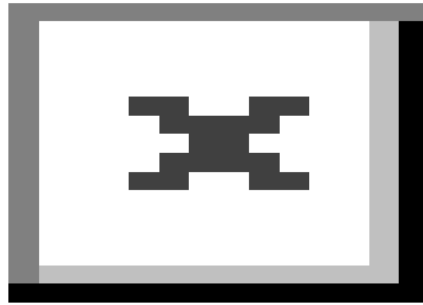


Figure 2: Summary statistics of construction tenders in settlements provided by the NGO Peace Now.

4. (SBU) The Ministry of Housing and the Israel Land Authority also announced on January 20 the publication of tenders for the construction of 2,112 housing units in settlements in the West Bank, with the tenders scheduled to open for bidding as early as February 16 (see figure 1). The 2,112 units for settlements in this tender exceed the 1,785 total units tendered in settlements in 2020 and make 2021 the fourth-highest year for tenders since 2002 to date, according to data provided by Israeli NGO Peace Now (see figure 2). On January 18, the Israel Land Authority announced tenders for an additional 460 housing units in northeastern Jerusalem.

Fewer Units Announced in First Higher Planning Council Meeting of 2021

5. (SBU) The Civil Administration's Higher Planning Council convened on January 17, and approved 11 residential plans for 780 units as well as an industrial plan (see figure 3). Specifically, the Civil Administration approved 415 units for deposit (the first major stage in the process) and 365 units for validation (the final major stage). The 780 total units approved were much lower than at any of the meetings in 2020, when the HPC approved 1,936 units in January, 1,739 units in February, and 4,948 units in October (ref A and B). The announcement also included the retroactive legalization of two outposts as neighborhoods of nearby settlements, with the outpost of Havat Yair becoming part of Yakir, and Nofei Nehemia becoming part of Rechelim – itself a legalized former outpost.

Possible Political Implications Highlighted by Media, NGOs, While Settlers Focus on Community Needs

6. ~~(SBU)~~ Settlement-related announcements or campaign promises have previously been used to seek support from the settler community and right-wing voters; however, several Embassy contacts told us that the upcoming March 23 national election is largely personality-driven and that they expect the coronavirus response and the economy to dominate the political discourse. Kohelet Policy Forum legal expert Eugene Kontorovich told us there is no real disagreement across most of the Israeli political spectrum regarding the continued existence of settlements in the West Bank, and Regavim Director General Meir Deutsch estimated a significant majority of Knesset members and the Israeli public support sovereignty initiatives. Geneva Initiative Executive Director Gadi Baltiansky observed the Israeli public was "quite indifferent" about the settlements issue. Although Israeli press reported on January 31 that Netanyahu offered to advance planning for 9,000 housing units in the northern Jerusalem neighborhood of Atarot as part of a deal for Religious Zionism party head MK Bezael Smotrich to jointly run with the far-right Noam and Otzma Yehudit parties, our contacts were unable to confirm that Atarot was part of the final agreement between Smotrich and Netanyahu. Kontorovich speculated that the whole story sounded "planted" to spin up the settlements issue. A contact with the Jerusalem municipality told us they doubted the final master plan, still very early in the planning process, could reasonably include so many units.

7. ~~(SBU)~~ Israeli political commentary also focused on the timing of the announcements and the implications for the U.S.-Israel relationship. On January 11 Yesh Atid chairman MK Yair Lapid called the promotion of settlement construction plans an "irresponsible step" and an "unnecessary battle" with the new U.S. administration. Media reaction focused on the timing of these developments, highlighting that they came within days or even hours of the U.S. presidential inauguration and speculating on possible U.S. reactions when these developments occurred so close to the change in U.S. administrations. Ir Amim and Peace Now contacts emphasized their belief that the Israeli government rushed these moves to create a *fait accompli* before possible changes in U.S. policy with the new administration.

8. ~~(SBU)~~ By contrast, contacts at pro-settlement NGO Regavim appreciated that approvals were continuing and highlighted development needs in the settler community. A Binyamin Regional Council contact also focused on the number of units, especially in the planning approvals, as insufficient to support the settler community's housing needs, citing slowed population growth in 2020 that she attributed to lack of housing capacity exacerbated by a planning freeze several years ago. On January 21, Smotrich publicly expressed his disappointment in the government for not legalizing more outposts and promised to make outpost legalization part of any coalition agreement for his party to join a new government.

Palestinian Authority, Several Foreign Governments Criticize Recent Developments

9. ~~(SBU)~~ The Palestinian Authority presidential spokesperson on January 11 condemned the promotion of settlement plans and said that all settlements are illegal under international law. Prime Minister Shtayyeh said on January 18 that he hoped the Biden administration would stop the "unprecedented settlement assault" in the West Bank and East Jerusalem, and that the world should take a stand against settlements and protect the two-state solution. The recent development announcements also sparked strong criticism from several diplomatic missions, including the EU and the UK, that the developments undermine the viability of a two-state solution. Several Western diplomats told us Palestinian Authority officials were upset that the United States had not yet condemned the action.

I hope this email finds you well and I apologize for sending this email so late in the work day! Hady Amr (DAS, Israel and Palestinian Affairs) will be traveling to Israel tomorrow for political consultations after his meeting with FM Safadi, but there has been some concern that Ben Gurion airport may close if there is further rocket fire from Gaza. Due to the important nature of his trip, if he is unable to travel direct to Israel itself, we would like to request that he be allowed to land in Jordan and cross over the King Hussein Bridge into the West Bank and then to Israel. He will be joined on this trip by Charles Scott Leith, his Special Advisor on Israeli-Palestinian Negotiations. Below you will find a scanned copy of DAS Amr's diplomatic passport and I will send along a copy of Mr. Leith's when I have it.

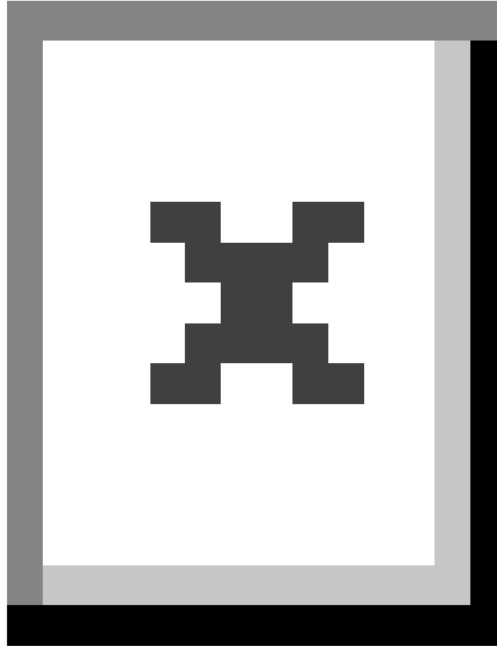
